

Formula SAE Technical Bulletin:

Adding & Mounting Your Car's RFID Tag



What's Changing


- FSAE Timing & Scoring uses passive RFID tags to all cars competing in US competitions
- Any tags used from previous FSAE competitions in the USA will work and should be used again. If you do not have a tag from a past year you may ask for one at Registration.
- Tags will be functionally-checked and linked to your car number at Brake Check
- Equipment at short events will automatically read your tag to identify your car number. Endurance will still use the timing transponder.
- We're doing this to help reduce errors in the timing process and allow for further automation of short events


This passive RFID tag:

- Has no battery; never needs charging
- Will be used this year at all dynamic short events & endurance
- Does NOT replace (or interfere with) your MYLAPS transponder
- Should be used year-after-year for all future US competitions
- Might be used during the stages of Tech and other events in the future



Mounting Location


Mount to a vertical frame member on the DRIVER'S LEFT SIDE of the vehicle



NOTE: Distance from front of vehicle does NOT affect lap timing

Notes & Details

- Must be mounted on the driver's left side of the vehicle
- Must be mounted at a height between 305mm and 915mm (12"-36") above the ground
- Must be mounted "vertically" ($\pm 30^\circ$)
- Must face "outward" 45° ($\pm 30^\circ$) from the front/back centerline of the car
(Photo shows tag mounted at 90° as instructed in 2016)
- Must not be covered by conductive (metallic, composite) material
- If mounting to a frame tube is undesirable, can be mounted to any material (metallic, plastic, composite) on the car in the vicinity described
- Mount using sound engineering practices



Summary

- **If you have an RFID tag from a previous US competition, use it. If not, pick up your RFID tag at Registration**
- **Mount it to your car as described in this bulletin before entering Mechanical Tech**
- **Leave it on your car until after Endurance**
- **Keep it and use it again next year**
- **You still need a MYLAPS transponder for Endurance**
